Melissa Shearing our Support Teacher takes up a position as a classroom teacher at Sandy Bay Infant School. Melissa has done a great job in her role at our school but has a strong desire to return to classroom teaching to follow her passion in this area.

I am pleased to advise that **Dorothy Raymond** has been appointed as permanent Assistant Principal at our school. This is recognition of her outstanding skills and experience in school leadership and administration and her clear vision about how to improve the lives and opportunities for our students. Dorothy's role will be as AP Student Support and Operations.

Carolyn Dunstan is appointed as Acting Assistant Principal – Curriculum - to lead Literacy program development and other areas of schoolwide curriculum.

Chris Anagnostis has been appointed to the position of AST- Co-ordinator Student Support. Chris comes to us with a wealth of experience in roles as learning support, positive behaviour management and gifted education programs. Parents and carers will be advised of class placements next Friday with the End of Year reports that will be sent home with students.
